Football staff	JW
JW asked for an update on the club's footballing backroom staff following a few	
departures over the summer. He asked if there are less coaches than last season.	
TS explained the club bought in Jon De Souza before the summer as the individual coach	
and he has moved into a more regular coaching role. He said De Souza would also be	
monitoring the club's loan players to keep that connection with them. He said we also got	
Scott Marshall in who is used to working with Ben Garner and he is mostly looking at the	
attacking side. He added that one of the club's academy coaches, Anthony Hayes, has	
been supporting the men's first team too. He said JW was right that there were definitely	
changes there but on the training ground it is not like we have been missing out. There	
have been enough resources, it is just a change in personnel.	
CR said it seems like there is a sense of excitement amongst the Addicks, a new season,	
new Manager. There is a sense of excitement, everyone is really looking forward to the	
new season.	
JW said the style of football is 100% improved and he thinks it is down to the fans being	
patient with it. He said it is a completely different style to what we are used to as Charlton	
fans, the players are there and the Manager is in place. He said it is down to the fans being	
patient with it, don't get on the players back too early on in the season.	
AH said the fans in Scotland want to give the new team the chance to prove themselves.	
Academy players	AH
AH said we haven't seen the name Daniel Kanu mentioned much recently, is there any	
reason for that?	
TS said it looks like he is staying with the academy. Of those people in the academy we had	
trained within the first few weeks it looks primarily Deji Elerewe that is being integrated,	
Miles Leaburn clearly. Aaron Henry and Charles Clayden are also doing well. He said we are	
probably going to move more U23 players out on loan compared to the past so they can	
grow faster but it also allows the U18s more chances to play at a higher level with the U23	
team. We are going to make some changes to that.	
Player signings	JM
JW asked if there were any more permanent signings to join the Addicks.	
TS said there was one permanent signing in particular the club were working on. Post-	
meeting note – Jack Payne signed on a permanent deal the following week.	
VE asked about signings for the women's team. TS said that pretty much all the players on	
the Women's team were on short-term contracts so they are either being renewed, and	
few are getting long-term contracts such as two years + an option etc. He said there is a lot	1
of switching up because of the shortness of those contracts, which is still a common thing.	
He said it is what we call a revolving door with a lot of new faces coming in as we speak.	1
They are getting ready for the season and actually going up to Scotland for pre-season.	
AH asked whether fans could attend.	1
TR said the club would look into it and update.	
Point of contact	CR
CR asked who is the new fan liaison officer, who do I contact if I need help with	1
something?	

RM said she has been taking care of emails and trying to stay in contact. She said a lot of	
fans are excited about the start of the season. She said she met Lisa Squires around three	
or four months ago and she used to be the fan liaison individual at the club for several	
years. She said they were speaking back then about how we can continue to improve the	
fan experience. She said more recently when we had a need for that role to be filled she	
reached out for her and she was more than happy to come on board. She said LS is with	
the club part-time, she can talk more about herself and her experience and we also have	
another individual who is going to start on July 27 th , mostly on matchdays but also in office	
work, getting items we need and making sure people get responded to. She said he will be	
engaged in these types of meetings as well. She said as soon as he starts we will introduce	
him to the supporters.	
LS said that her background with the football club is that she worked here five years ago as	
club development manager. She was with the club for 17 years, she has a lot of experience	
and knows a lot about Charlton Athletic, and is also a fan. She encouraged the group to get	
in touch via the <u>fans@cafc.co.uk</u> email address.	
CR asked if LS is the first point of contact rather than LB.	
LB said it is worth including both. She said how it has worked previously is anything to do	
with the nuts and bolts of the club things like ticketing it would be LS that you deal with	
and she works for the club day to day, whereas LB is not employed by the club. She said	
what she is working on is more of the long-term project and strategic things. She said she	
has been doing a lot around 'FillTheValley' and the focus groups there. She said she has	
had a couple of meetings around the 30th anniversary of Back to The Valley which is later	
this year.	
RM said if there is an issue that you feel the club isn't being responsive then LB	
as Fan Adviser is the person you want to go to. She will come to us and say this	
item or process is impacting an international fan base or group/person then we	
can address the issue internally.	
CharltonTV packages	CR
CR said that members of her group were renewing their CharltonTV subscriptions and	
asked about a clear discount for members of international supporters' groups. She asked	
what the discount would be and how supporters would be able to redeem it.	
TR said the club would look into this and confirm shortly. He said the club didn't quite get	
it right last season but it will be clear and simple this season.	
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for Charlton, has a bar in North Carolina. He said they are having a get together there and	I
Mike has invited a number of ex-players that he has played with.	
It was recommended that a monthly newsletter, which includes information from the	
supporters' groups on events they have going on, is sent to all international supporters.	
Combined fundraiser	CR
CR said it was something that occurred to her as we are developing a community as	CN
supporters' clubs as there may be something we want to do together. She said last year	
the North American Addicks set up a fundraiser for the Upbeats. She asked if there is	
something we want to do together that combines all the clubs?	
PC explained his group did two last year, one being a fundraiser for the Upbeats. He said	
the group worked with the guys at the museum as they have to fund themselves, so they	
would buy items from the museum and put it on as a monthly auction. At the end of the	
month we get the payment from the individual who won and then the museum ships it	
straight to them. He said last year the group raised a good amount of money for the

Club shop and shipping costs	CR
CR asked if, with Castore coming in, international supporters would get some sort of break	
on shipping costs.	
PC said the first question is whether Castore are going to start shipping internationally as	
they currently do not.	
RM said the club have been addressing that on a daily basis with them. She said the club	
will be able to have conversations with you once we understand what the cost will actually	
be.	
She said Castore have assured the club that there will be more available online.	
JW said while the home kit design is great, Castore seem quite disjointed and, from a	
club's perspective, you must be quite disappointed with the partnership with them.	
RM said she did not want to say anything bad about a partnership that we have in place.	
She said the club have had some challenges but the club are in regular dialogue with	
Castore to have everything in place.	
PC said there are a lot of Newcastle fans in Arizona and this is their second season with	
Castore. He said they said they had the teething problems that we are seeing last year but this season the stuff is already out there and they have a phenomenal away kit. He said all	
the Newcastle fans here love Castore.	
RM agreed the brand and quality is outstanding.	
MS suggested a potential minimum shipping fee if you spend a certain amount.	
Fans' Bar	MS
MS asked about giving the Fans' Bar a nicer entrance that pays tribute to the club's history.	
TR referenced the club have redesigned the main reception to pay tribute to the last 30	
years.	
LB said she was at The Valley earlier that day, having not been for a while and the new	
reception looks really good.	
MS said he knows a lot of international fans come in and are confused as to where they	
can sit or what they can do. He said if there is a point for them to go and receive	
information about the club it would be easier for international fans to find each other	
within the bar.	
RM said it is not the most pleasant and inviting reception in the Fans' Bar. She said there	
are probably a few things we can do to make that entrance more exciting.	
Loyalty points	CR
CR asked to have some sort of loyalty points connected to the CharltonTV subscription, in	
the same way as a season ticket would earn those points.	
TR said this topic has been discussed internally at the club. He said there is definitely some	
substance to that, especially given the price compared to our season tickets. He said	
loyalty points are being reviewed at the moment and we can hopefully update that in due	
course.	
RM said obviously some of the international supporters can get over here easier than	
others right now and that loyalty points are really important for buying away tickets at a	
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priority level, if that is not something you are doing what would be of value to you? We don't want it to be points for the sake of points, we want it to be something that is of value to you. PC said for international fans the obvious choice would be the club shop. JW said it would be nice to have crack of getting away tickets for a big game.	
CharltonTV	Club
TR said the club's aim is to have international supporters on each matchday, whether it be	
an interview or pre-recorded message.	
Supporters who are interested should email website@cafc.co.uk.	
RM said this partly came from feedback from Scott Minto and Steve Brown who wanted to see more international fans on the show.	
VE said that the Swedish Addicks are having their annual meeting on September. TR said	
the club would definitely cover this on CharltonTV.	
TR asked the groups to let the club know if they are doing any events as we would love to	
cover that on social media. He said the club want more fans front and centre on	
everything.	
RM said if the groups are aware of any international youth supporters who would like to	
be a part of the youth advisory group, we are selecting additional people to join that	
group.	
AH asked about CharltonTV games being available in full on catchup. TR said the club are	
in a better position on that. He said EFL regulations still restrict them but the full broadcast	
of games will be available earlier than they were last season.	
TR said the club should be allowed to show Saturday 3pm games during the World Cup. TS	
said that at the annual meeting with the EFL, the club owners and CEOs voted on if we	
should allow that or not. He said he felt things were moving in the right direction in terms	
of streaming.
